

High glamour fused with functionality

It's not often glamour and functionality go hand-in-hand, but the two have been paired in this Tuart Hill custom-built home.

Inspired Homes director Vas Spaseski has built an opulent home for his family where careful attention was paid to design and practicality.

The home's front elevation of cedar-lined portico, French-cut travertine cladding and mirror pivot door hints at what's behind.

Upon entry, the home immediately states its design credentials. Gazing up, a 3m-plus crystal chandelier hangs in the sunlit 6.8m void, while ahead a white quartz-clad wall with Cosmo fireplace terminates the view line.

Past the cloakroom and down the WA blackbutt-floored hallway, an in-built corner fish tank overlooks the contemporary kitchen.

Glamour extends to the kitchen in the sparkling wedge Quantum Quartz benchtop, gloss white automatic Servo-Drive cupboards, smoked ice mirror splashback and Ilve appliances.

A stacking window acts as a servery through to the cedar-lined alfresco area. A built-in drinks fridge, barbeque and sink means Vas and Danielle Spaseski have little reason to leave the city views here.

Another chandelier hangs over the dining area, which flows through to the lounge with two bulkhead ceilings lit by blue LED channel lighting.

A four-step cornice has been used throughout to complement

the clean lines and modern white and grey colour scheme.

Making light work of housework, functional touches include ducted vacuum, laundry chute and walk-in robes in all five bedrooms.

Built on a subdivided block, the home makes maximum use of space with a powder room and a cellar/storage area beneath the stairs.

Upstairs opens to a second living area, where Mr Spaseski has capitalised on the views from a balcony to the city skyline.

A fully fitted-out kitchenette and study nook finish off the upstairs living area.

The main suite has twin walk-in robes, a purpose-built dressing table with make-up lights and an ensuite.

A hydrotherapy spa bath, etched grey and white tiles, ducted heating and cooling, and waterfall-edged stone benchtops in the ensuite continue the home's glamour.

The second upstairs bathroom also shows off clean lines with a frameless hobless shower, spa bath and grey mosaic feature wall.
